STUDENT'S GUIDE Discussion Questions: The Parable of the Lamp on a Stand

Introduction: The Lamp on a Stand parable can be found in three Synoptic Gospels: Matthew 5:14-16, Mark 4:21-25, and Luke 8:16-18. Understanding this parable requires reading all three Gospels. Mark and Luke convey a similar message, while Matthew includes two crucial verses (14 and 16) that enhance the message. Reading only Matthew would miss essential details from Mark and Luke. In this article, we will explore the parable drawing from all three Gospels. Additionally, we will address a common misinterpretation of the message in Mark and provide a detailed explanation.

- You are the light of the world. (Read the verse outlined in red Matthew 5:14). Why does Jesus call the disciples the light of the world. Didn't Jesus say He was the light of the world in John 8:12?
- 2. A city on a hill cannot be hidden. What does it mean a city on a hill cannot be hidden?
- 3. What is the Parable "A city on a hill cannot be hidden?"
- The lamp on a stand. (Read the verses outlines in black: Matthew 5:15, Mark 4:21, Luke 8:16). Why is the lamp not covered or put under a basket?
- 5. Why is the lamp set on a lampstand?
- 6. Who is the lamp?

We will address a common misinterpretation of the message in Mark and provide a detailed explanation.

- 11. The measurement of good and evil (Read verses highlighted in purple: Mark 4:23-25, and Luke 8:18) What measurement is Jesus talking about? Is it used for evil?
- 12. How is the measurement used for good?
- **13. Let your light shine!** (Read verse highlighted in blue: Matthew 5:16) What does it mean to let your light shine before men?
- 14. How is Jesus looking for you to demonstrate your good works before men so they may praise you? Are the men supposed to see your good works, that glorify God? Or are the good works performed to glorify God, and men see the good works?
- 15. How should you let your light shine before men?
